April giving was up from the three previous months and May was better than February and March. The \$2,216 made from the Ham Loaf Dinner went into the general fund and will be a big help going forward.


Our current general fund balance is: \$12,544.91 which is down \$10,571.87 since the beginning of the year.

#### FROM OUR 2023 SYNOD ASSEMBLY DELEGATES: Chris & Shirley Zierke

"THE SYNOD ASSEMBLY IS A GOOD WAY TO UNDERSTAND ALL THE WORK BEING DONE WITHIN THE SYNOD & THROUGHOUT THE WORLD" We attended the Synod Assembly on April 28 and 29<sup>th</sup> at Cragun's resort in Brainerd. Friday's session lasted from 6:00 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. Saturday's session was from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. There was also a session on Sunday, but we were unable to attend that one.

Friday: 262 people attended the Friday session. The session began with a welcome from Bishop Amy Odgren. This was followed by a

moving worship service. The rest of the evening was devoted to establishing the guidelines for the rest of the meeting as well as the report of the nominating committee. As all positions were unopposed or vacant, we were able to vote on the slate of candidates very quickly. We were also presented with a first look at the budget.

Saturday: 278 people attended the Saturday session. Following morning prayer, we heard a series of reports from Rachel Berry (Synod Vice President), Rev Kathryn Tiede (LSS, MN) and Sarah Cutter (ELCA churchwide representative). Hinckley received the LSS Servant of Christ Award. Knife River received the Holy Cow award by donating \$74.99 per confirmed member to ELCA World Hunger. We also heard from Rev Victor St. George about his work at the NE Regional Correctional Center, as well as from Luther Crest, Onomia and Vermillion, camps within our synod. We had reports from WELCA (Lynda Lochner), Mental Health & Wellness (Joy Hensel), Together Here (Matthew Cobb). Together we celebrated anniversaries and milestones in ministry. We reviewed the updated salary and benefits guidelines. A resolution on Tiny Houses was passed. This resolution asks for legislation that will allow religious organizations to build tiny home communities on their property without interference from local units of government. Constitution changes were sent back to the Synod Council for clarification. The vote on the changes was postponed until next year.

We had special Discipleship Conversations around the theme of The Son makes you free to Welcome, Connect, Reform, and Support. These were a good way to get to know the people at our table as well as those sitting around us.

The Synod Assembly is a good way to understand all the work being done within the synod and throughout the world. The worship services are a definite highlight.

The 2024 Synod Assembly will be Saturday, April 27, 2024 – Online only, one day only. Start thinking now if this is something you would like to attend.



Dan holds a special spot in the history of Immanuel. He recently wrote a letter to Immanuel with portions of his life noted. Dan was born in 1934 and raised on the farm on south side of Highway 70 across from Immanuel Cemetery. He was the only child of Henry and Hulda Holmberg.

Early school days were at the Brunswick School House on the north side of Hwy. 70 and graduation from Mora. Following school days, he joined the Army with two friends, Jim Richardson and Jerry Dennewith. The last year of service was spent in Germany and then home to work in Minneapolis area at Standard Oil Stations.

"Never married – alcohol came first in my life. I got God back in life and found what my Mother tried to help me with. I've got God in my life and what a wonderful life today."

Dan was a lifelong member of Immanuel – baptism, Dec. 1934; confirmation, 1948. His Mother and Dad made sure he was in Church every Sunday. Recently when the Times newspaper had the Immanuel stained glass window on the front page, just looking at that made him feel at *home* all over again.

Dan wrote: "After my Mother died and when my Dad was in Mora Nursing Home and two young men from Immanuel got into conversation about getting some land for the church so after good advice from my parents that whenever Immanuel needs anything – help them so I got the opportunity and we worked out a deal." Soon the arrangements were made and over 70 acres of land were 'gifted' to Immanuel. The land now is the site for the parsonage, ball field and the church building as well as land clear to the river. Thank you to Dan for his gift to Immanuel.

Dan passed away in Arizona in 2022; a memorial service and burial was held on Saturday, June 3, 2023 at the Brunswick Lutheran Church cemetery, right across the way from his childhood home.

We give thanks for Dan's life and legacy.


