[Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Solome] went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid (Mark 16:8).

Jesus is risen! Alleluia!

On a professional level, I regret that I was unable to be with you for the great celebration of the Festival of the Resurrection (aka. Easter) or the other profound times of Holy Week. But, on the other hand, I'm probably beaming about the birth of Hannah—at least I hope so, as I'm writing this a week or so before she's scheduled to be born. Sometime you'll get to meet her. But, back to the topic at hand: Easter. The entire month of April this year falls into the Season of Easter (the longest "festival" season of the Church year), so I want to take this time to do a little bit of what I might have thought of doing as an Easter sermon—or at least some thoughts that would go

The Gospel of Mark was the first written gospel, and was penned somewhere around the year 70 CE;

Matthew, Luke and John would follow approximately 10-20 years later. The quote with which I began this letter is the proper ending of the Gospel of Mark.



Our liturgical response "Jesus is risen! Alleluia! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!" hardly seems fitting to this Markan ending. The women leaving the tomb, afraid and not telling anyone, is an ending that has perplexed people almost back to the origin of the written Gospel of Mark.

If you open your Bible to the end of Mark's gosinto such a sermon—using the text of this year, Mark. pel, you will notice some strange things, likely in double brackets, called "The Shorter Ending of Mark" and "The Longer Ending of Mark." To address these, I'm going to delve a little bit into what's called "textual criticism" (something that I probably wouldn't have actually done in the sermon); the "goal" of textual criticism is to arrive at the most original version of the text. This is a challenge because all presentlydiscovered, extant, early manuscripts have some physical degradation and are not complete texts. Therefore, textual criticism is sort-of like putting together a puzzle, and one of the main criteria for how to put the puzzle together is that, contrary to how we might think it would happen, copiers would be more likely to "fix" something using their own vocabulary, theology, and knowledge than insert something "incorrect." from oral traditions, and, as a result of either slightly different community oral traditions or acts of copying, there are multiple, written (of course in Koine Greek), "ancient" versions of each Gospel (and other New Testament writings, too)—and these do not always agree; most of the variations in them are technical or grammatical matters—but that's not the case with the ending of Mark. The case with Mark seems to be that some early copiers, like many since, didn't like how Mark ended with the women leaving afraid, and telling no one what they had experienced—so they decided to "fix" it, by adding more details. In fact, the longer ending seems to have been written by someone familiar with the other canonical gospels who wanted to get Mark's ending to align to postresurrection stories in those gospels. But here's the perplexing question: Is the end really the end? After all, we know that the

. Continued on page 3 what had happened at the tomb—well, somebody told the story, and if it wasn't them, why make them witnesses in the first place? Something else to remember is how the Gospel of Mark began: "The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God" (Mark 1:1, my emphasis). What about, as the

late Paul Harvey would say, the "rest of the story?" With the proper ending being so unsatisfying, we can't help but asking that question. Mark's writing may be technically unsophisticated, but it is stylistically profound. Mark didn't leave us hanging to spite us, but to get us to ask about the rest of the good news of Jesus Christ; indeed, he almost invites what later editors/copiers did—just maybe to not have it appended to his work, but done in our thoughts (and sermons). Maybe the story continues in our lives (where "our" is heard as all, from its original hearers down through the centuries to us, who find the Son of God in the pages of what Mark has termed a "gospel")?

The good news of Jesus Christ has no endings—especially no neat endings—for it continues to live and grow in each of us. The Word is, after all, a living Word. We may not say "Alleluia!" (remember this means "Praise to the LORD") to the women leaving afraid and saying nothing. But we can—and should—say that to the good news (and ministry) of Jesus Christ continuing in us.

Christ is risen! The Life of Christ continues in us! Alleluia!
