Taken from Highlights of Timeline from Building Committee

October 25, 1998:

A special congregational meeting was held. Dick Nord addressed the building goals and special concerns were addressed. The vote was 72% of members attending to move the church. The building proposal was approved 52 to 8. There is \$ 148,131.23 in the building fund. Dick Nehring said we might be able to meet in the Town Hall. It was moved, seconded and passed that we move the church in the spring. Total project estimate: \$ 400,642 (volunteer labor could lower total cost)

From Archive Committee – 25th Anniversary of moving the church!

Chapter I—Church to move (a little)
As Kevin Peterson recalls, the first time someone suggested putting the Immanuel Lutheran Church building on wheels and moving it to adjacent field, the idea was "shot down in a hurry."



Church members have spent years looking at ways to add space for Sunday School classrooms, enlarge the kitchen and fellowship area, and improve access to the elegant Brunswick landmark - - a true "Cadillac" among church structures, in Loren Barnick's words. He said builders back in the middle of the century "spared nothing" when erecting Immanuel Lutheran. Now, the expansion is about to happen. And guess what? They're going to put the church building on wheels and move it out to that level field a little west of where Immanuel Lutheran now stands!

Scholarship applicants 2024:

The scholarship application packets will be available in February from the church office and submitted by April I to the office or Donna Oslund's mailbox. The committee will review and submit them to the Council for final approval. Students must include their latest GPA (2.75 or above) with the application. If approved the money is sent the second semester to the college, and students must reapply every year. Scholarship Committee

FINANCIAL REPORT -

Financial Update: Current general fund balance is \$9,404.50. Each month we continue to transfer money, which would have been used for pastoral expenses, into the Misc. Transfer Acct., minus cost associated with not having a pastor. This shows us how we are doing as if we had a pastor. Our monthly average giving for 2022 was \$2,501.84 compared to \$2,152.59 for 2023. Needed weekly average giving (to meet 2024 budget as approved by the congregation at the 2023 annual meeting) is \$2,834.42. January looks like it will come in around \$1,500 for weekly average giving.

Parking Lot Update: Current Balance in parking lot account is \$3,821.05, with payments of \$508.77 monthly, this covers seven months. Our balance is \$35,514.89.



LENT

Wilderness. Waiting. Reflection. Repentance. Lent is all these things and more: the 40 days (plus Sundays) when Christians around the world take time to reflect on the suffering, death, and resurrection of our Lord Jesus. It is a time to examine our own walk as we follow Jesus — perhaps there are things cluttering our lives during this time that we "give up," or holy habits and practices we wish to add. Lent is a chance to reexamine our lives and refocus on our Lord who desperately wants to lead us into life.

ASH WEDNESDAY

February 14 7:00pm Worship

Ash Wednesday is the beginning of the Lenten journey. Join us for a quiet time of worship in song and prayer, scripture and silence, confession, ashes and communion. On this day, we mark a cross in ashes on foreheads as we remember our human frailty and turn to God in repentance. "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

PALM SUNDAY

March 24 9:00am Worship

The Palm Sunday Liturgy recreates the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem as we wave our palms and make our procession into the church. This joyful mood soon changes to sober contemplation of our Lord's Passion at the Gospel.

Thus, Holy Week begins.

MAUNDY THURSDAY

March 28 6:00pm Worship

Maundy Thursday commemorates the Last Supper of Jesus with his disciples. As we celebrate the Lord's Supper in Worship, we will also share a Potluck Dinner together. We will celebrate the Lord's Supper in two parts. In the first part, we will share the bread, the body of Christ. Then we will share in a potluck supper together. Following the meal and fellowship, we will celebrate part two of the Lord's supper with the wine, the blood of Christ. Worship continues on Good Friday. We will observe Good Friday, the day of the crucifixion of Jesus Christ, through word and song and silence, using a Tenebrae style service of the Seven Last Words of Christ.
